

LANGTONWITH SUTTERBY BOUNDARY PROJECT

This work is part of the CBA East Midlands Boundaries Project.

The aim of the project is to map the parish boundary and identify features of interest, such as hedges, ditches, banks, trees and roads.

The results will be added to a database that will build up over time and will eventually cover the whole of the East Midlands. The first part of the project will be to survey the features of the boundary and enter them on the database.

The second part will be data manipulation to give graphic illustrations of the results.

- The Sutterby Bounders are working in teams of four.
- They are recording the altitude and grid reference at suitable points along the boundary.
- Trees and plants are identified and the nature of the boundary noted.
- Most of the old Sutterby boundary has been surveyed and the teams will soon move on to the Langton boundary.

- The following pictures were taken during the survey of Sutterby Parish Boundary.
- Day one started on the northern boundary which runs along the centre of the road between Brinkhill and Sutterby.
- A white-board was used to record details as filling out paper forms in the wind proved to be quite difficult.



Although the boundary runs along the road, pictures were taken facing N, S, E, & W at suitable points.

The previous picture was taken at the junction of the road and the footpath to Brinkhill.

The following picture is of a plashed hedge alongside the road.









- The western boundary was surveyed on day two.
- It is clearly defined by a hedge.
- This boundary is quite beautiful with mature trees and old hawthorn hedging, as the following pictures show.







The southern and western boundaries of Sutterby have almost been completed and the team will soon move on to the Langton boundary.
